With behavior and veterinary expertise in house, along with a team of caregivers and adoption counselors who love our shelter pets like their own, our goal is completing families for a lifetime.

CrossRoads Adoption Program

CrossRoads animals have untreatable conditions and an unknown life expectancy, but they have no pain or suffering. In 2023, 15 CrossRoads pets went on to enjoy the end of their lives with some very special adopters. CrossRoads pets often live longer than we could have imagined, reminding us that with love, anything is possible.

Humane Law Enforcement

Many of the same societal factors that lead to pet relinquishment can also lead to abuse. Our Humane Law Enforcement team continued to see an increasing need for intervention and rescue. In partnership with local law enforcement, we held abusers accountable for their actions.

Behavior and Enrichment

Our Behavior and Enrichment Program is foundational to the sheltering and care we provide for every resident. Through healthy surroundings, interactive toys, outdoor exercise, play groups, field trips and whatever other means we could imagine to make our pets happy, we provided comfort and eased their stress.

Volunteers

Our incredible volunteers allowed us to give more time and attention to everything we did. Dog walking, direct animal care, adoption counseling, cleaning, helping with outreach events, and supporting our customer care staff were just some of the many ways they devoted over 18,000 hours of their time to transforming the lives of the animals and people in our community.

Humane Education

Nurturing humane values and actions through education is a high priority at MHHS. Through year-round programs and summer camps, we provided opportunities for kids of all ages to learn about animal safety and care. We also provided young people with ways to get involved and give back through volunteer activities.

Our dog training classes and seminar programs provided valuable educational resources for pet owners and animal advocates.

Through our adoption, veterinary, and behavior programs and services, we touch the lives of over 5,000 animals every year.




